**Subject:** Use of screening before referring patients for ADHD assessments

Q1 Do you use screening before referring individuals to be assessed for ADHD.

Definition being as per NHS:

- Screening: a triage process, using standardised tools and/or agreed processes and carried out by experienced Liaison and Diversion practitioners.
- Assessment including specialist assessment: carried out by someone with a specific professional mandate, i.e. with requisite professional skills.

- A2 Assessment has always taken place by a clinical professional prior to a referral being made from Alder Hey (AH) services to the ADHD service.
