

Phase one of Springfield Park is complete. The new grassed areas, trees and seeding will start to take hold in Autumn.


Work on the next phase has begun, which includes knocking down the last Hospital building sitting on parkland. Hospital staff will be moved into temporary offices next month. The site will then be cleared and the remaining parkland returned. The Park is set to be complete by Summer 2023!

MUGA Granted Planning Approval!

Work has begun on the Multi Use Games Area (MUGA). The City Council has agreed planning permission on this popular feature which includes a 5-aside football pitch and basketball court.

What's new at Alder Hey!

A new mental health inpatient facility (Sunflower House) and community outpatient facility (Catkin Centre) are almost finished.

These new buildings will help Alder Hey provide even better care to some of our most vulnerable children and young people.

After being showcased at the Chelsea Flower Show, the 'Alder Hey Urban Foraging Station' has been replanted outside the new buildings. The garden was designed by Hugh and Howard Miller to



reflect the benefits of outdoor space on the mental and physical health of children and young people.

Work has also begun on an exciting new Surgical Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) next to the A&E department. The NICU will be the first of its kind in the country.

"We were really keen to design a Unit that would have parents and families right at the heart of their new baby's care. Our new NICU will ensure that new babies needing surgery can remain in one place with their parent or family members. The new Unit will also mean that our most vulnerable babies aren't coming back and forth between hospitals for treatment." Jen Deeney, Neonatal Nurse
