- A1 Four cases in total: One settled in 2016 one settled in 2018 one in 2022, ongoing, at preliminary hearing stage one in 2023- ongoing, at preliminary hearing stage

- A2 2019/20 £29,960 2020/21 - £3,370 2021/22 - £315 2022/23 - £8,442 2023/24 - £17,489
