Allergy checking, interaction checking, dose range checking. Dose range checks for maximum single doses and maximum daily doses based in age and weight flag warnings to prescribers

If no, do you use another system to do this within pharmacy or with prescribers & How do you communicate medication changes across providers? If yes, what does the system do? And what are your top issues with the system?
- A4 Yes, for all age groups.

Meditech Expanse, documentation of home meds, reconciliation to inpatient and reconciliation to discharge or TTOs. The additions, changes and stopped medication flows to the discharge letter to GPs. The main issue is having an up-to-date medication history and use it to reconcile.
