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Subject: Legal Fees - Dr SB v AH

- Please can you tell me the total spend of your trust on lawyers on the case of Dr Sasha Burn? This includes solicitors and barristers fees for:
 - The High Court and Court of Appeal (where the Trust had both a KC and a junior);
 - Any lawyers who attended Dr Burn's disciplinary hearing and appeal;
 - preparation for the High Court, Court of Appeal and the ET;
 - preliminary hearing and open preliminary hearing for the ET;
 - Any other solicitors fees in relation to your handling of Dr Burn's case.
- A1 Expenditure on legal advice and representation relating to Dr Burn's 2021 proceedings against the Trust in the High Court and Court of Appeal (where the Trust **did not** have junior counsel) was £168,238. The Trust successfully defended Dr Burn's action and was awarded costs following the Court of Appeal judgment. The Trust subsequently recovered £145,000 of the total above. The quantum spend therefore was £23,238.

Expenditure post Court of Appeal to date is £90,037.

- Q2 Please can you give me the total amount spent by your Trust on:
 - The "Root Cause Analysis" review into the death of 'Patient A' (as they are referred to in the high court hearing here: https://oldsquare.co.uk/wp-content/uploads/2021/12/Burn-v-Alder-Hey.pdf)
 - The report by an independent doctor, Dr Robert Campbell, dated 15 November 2019 into the death of 'Patient A' (also referenced in the High Court judgment)
 - Any other reports / investigations into the death of Patient A, including the report by the 'Australian neurosurgeon' (ref here: https://www.liverpoolecho.co.uk/news/liverpoolnews/stalemate-over-childs-death-leaves-21091361)
 - The formal MHPS investigation into Dr Sasha Burn (referred to in the High Court judgment).
- A2 Information not held It is not possible to quantify expenditure on routine, internal processes associated to a case such as this, such information is not compiled or held in this manner.

The fee for the case note review commissioned from the Royal College of Surgeons was £3000.

The fee for the independent review undertaken by Dr Robert Campbell was £24,113.
